ALCON:

The focus of this month's safety sound-bite is ORM.

In addition to CAP, I'm part of the National Disaster Medical System (HHS/OS/ASPR/OPEO/NDMS/DMAT/IA-1). They recently developed a HERA form (Hazard Exposure Risk Assessment), and provide all members deploying with the HERA for that specific deployment. Although a HERA for the Training Summit (a conference) in Nashville this spring seemed a bit overkill, it was a good introduction to the new tool in a non-stressful, non-austere deployment.

A copy of the critical components is attached for your consideration (the actual HERA is *for official use only*, so is not being distributed to SD CAP!). It seems an appropriate format to guide our safety briefings for missions and other activities. Although CAPR does not require a *written* safety briefing, distributing a HERA-like document as part of the verbal safety briefing may be a way to be additionally proactive as safety officers.
