2012 JOINT DAKOTA ENCAMPMENT LOGO

The 2012 Joint Dakota Encampment was held 5-15 July 2012 at Camp Grafton, the main Army National Guard installation in North Dakota, located near Devils Lake.

Joint Dakota Encampments alternate between Camp Grafton in even numbered years and Camp Rapid, SD in odd numbered years.

The four-color logo for the 2012 Joint Dakota Encampment was an embroidered patch with merrowed (overlock sewn) edge. The patch was attached by ironing on a participant's t-shirt. Customarily, each flight at an encampment wears a different color t-shirt. Black, shown below, was worn by members of the encampment's cadet staff.

The scroll at the bottom bears the encampment's Latin motto "Ultra Mea Fines" (Beyond My Limits). JDCLE in the upper left corner stands for Joint Dakota Cadet Leadership Encampment. Each encampment generally focuses on one or more aspects of the Cadet Program. In 2012 it focused on teaching cadets the fine art of leadership. The year of the encampment is in the lower right. The four red jet fighter aircraft with contrails represent CAP's four missions; Emergency Services, Aerospace Education, Cadet Programs and Drug Demand Reduction.

The patch was designed by CAP Lieutenant Colonel B.T. Marking, the 2012 Joint Dakota Encampment Commander, who also approved it for wear.
