Heraldry of the 2016 WILDERNESS SURVIVAL SCHOOL LOGO


The 2016 Wilderness Survival School, a joint activity of the South Dakota Wing and the Boy Scouts of America, was originally to be held 29 April to 1 May. However, due to severe weather it was postponed until the following weekend. It was held 13-15 May at the 400-acre Lewis and Clark Scout Camp located 10 miles west of Yankton on the shore of Lewis and Clark Lake.





The design consists of five small green logos on the upper left front. From left to right they are; a first aid cross, a compass, a campfire, three utensils and someone sleeping in a bed under a cutaway of a roof. On the back of the shirt is a stylized forest in green with "Wilderness Survival School" in large white letters above it. Below this, flanking the center tree is "CAP" on the left and "BSA" on the right in white uppercase letters. At the bottom of the forest, below the center tree is "2016" in white numbers.

There were two variants of this design. The first, described and shown above, was for activity participants. The second variant was for activity staff and has the word "Staff" in large white uppercase letters above the five small green logos on the left front.



The logo was designed by C/Capt. Nicholas Nash of the Sioux Falls Composite Squadron in March 2016. The design was approved for wear by Col. John Seten, South Dakota Wing Commander, and Col. Robert Todd, North Central Region Commander.
